MINUTES OF THE THIRD MEETING

The Evaluation Committee for the selection of one tenure-track – probationary assistant professor (ricercatore a tempo determinato) for the Academic Recruitment Field “Political Science” (SC 14/A2) - Academic Discipline “Political Science” (SSD SPS/04) - at the Academic Faculty of Social Sciences and Institute of Law, Politics and Development (Dirpolis) of Sant’Anna School of Advanced Studies, Pisa pursuant to Italian Law No. 240/2010, Art. 24 paragraph 3 letter B, as formulated before the entry into force of the Law 79/2022, appointed by decree of the Rector No. 346 of May; 23 2023, consists of:

- Prof. Pinar Bilgin Full Professor at the Bilkent University;
- Prof. Nicolò Conti, Full Professor of the Academic Recruitment Field Political Science (SC 14/A2) at the University UNITELMA Sapienza, designated member by DIRPOLIS Institute;
- Prof. Andrea Ruggeri, Full Professor of Political Science and International Relations at the Oxford University.

The Committee convened for the third time, via teleconference, on June, 23, 2023, at 8.30 a.m., from the following locations:

Prof. Bilgin, located in Duisburg, connected via Google Meet

Prof. Conti, located in Sesto Fiorentino (Florence), connected via Google Meet

Prof. Ruggeri, located in Savona, connected via Google Meet

The President ascertained that all the members of the Committee were present and he declared the session open.

The President took note that no candidate has submitted a waiver to participate in the selection and that each member of the Committee has received the link to access online the applications of the candidates and has examined the documents they have submitted.

The President recalled that the object of today's meeting is to make the preliminary assessment of seven candidates in order to admit to the public discussion the six of them comparatively more deserving, pursuant to Italian Law No. 240/2010, Art. 24 paragraph 2.

Then, each member of the Committee illustrated her/his individual assessment on the qualifications, curriculum and scientific production of the candidates, pursuant to the criteria established in the preliminary meeting. The named assessments are annexed to and form an integral part of the present minutes (Annex No. 1).

The Committee then examined the publications, curriculum and teaching activities of the candidates, confronted their individual assessments and made the collegiate assessments attached to the minutes of which they are an integral part (Annex No. 2).

On the basis of the comparative evaluation among the candidates, the Committee decided to admit to the public discussion the following candidates:

ANNEX 1 – INDIVIDUAL ASSESSMENTS

CANDIDATE *Id 1143937*

PROF. PINAR BILGIN

The candidate holds a PhD in Political Science from Sciences Po, Paris (2011). He has been a Senior Fellow at the Scuola Superiore Meridionale since 2022. Since finishing his PhD studies, he has held a series of research and teaching fellowships at respectable international institutions, including two Marie Curie fellowships at Georgetown and LSE and a European University Institute Max Weber fellowship. He has presented at several academic departments and international conferences, including one APSA workshop. He has teaching experience in several institutions on IR and international relations of the Middle East. He is in the editorial board of the journal *Violence: An International Journal*.

The candidate has submitted 15 publications. 2 of these publications are books. One is a monograph published by a respectable international commercial publisher. The other is an edited volume by a respectable UK university press. He has also submitted 7 book chapters, all internationally published. The candidate has also submitted 6 articles published in journals of moderate ranking, known mostly for publishing case studies and less so for theoretically and/or methodologically innovative scholarship.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. NICOLÒ CONTI

The candidate holds a PhD in Political Science from Sciences Po, Paris (2011). He has been a Senior Fellow at the Scuola Superiore Meridionale since 2022. He has held a series of research and teaching fellowships at international institutions, including two Marie Curie fellowships at Georgetown and LSE and a European University Institute Max Weber fellowship. He has presented at several academic international conferences some of which of the most recognised international scientific organisations in the field of Political Science. He has teaching experience in several institutions in the field of Political Science. He is in the editorial board of the journal *'Violence: An International Journal'*.

The candidate has submitted 15 publications of varying quality and ambition. Two are monographs published by recognised international publishers. Seven are book chapters and other six are articles published in journals of diverse reputation and, overall, with average recognition.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. ANDREA RUGGERI

The candidate is Senior Fellow at Scuola Superiore Meridionale. He holds a PhD in Political Science from Sciences Po (2011). Between 2017 and 2020 he was Marie Skłodowska Curie Fellow at Georgetown and LSE. He was EUI Max Weber Fellow from 2013 and until 2015 and Postdoctoral Fellow at the University Paris St Denis Vincennes (2011-2012). He has visiting spells of different lengths at Sciences Po, LSE, University of Oxford, and National University of Singapore. He has presented in several academic departments and international conferences. He has teaching experience in several institutions on IR in the Middle East and global politics. He is in the editorial board of the journal *"Violence"*.

He has presented 15 publications and research products, the overall research agenda is about radical Islamism, violence and politics in the Middle East and foreign policy toward the region. The production shows an upward trajectory with some relevant contributions in the field of Political

Science: a monograph with Palgrave (that is a translation from a French monograph published with L'Harmattan), 1 edited volume, 5 articles, 7 book chapters and 1 contribution to a non-peer review volume.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

CANDIDATE Id 1165791

PROF. PINAR BILGIN

The candidate holds a PhD in Political Science-Political Theory from Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies (2003). He has taught at the University level since 2001 at Università degli Studi di Pisa, Universidade Nova de Lisboa Instituto de Filosofia (with a break during 2013-15). Previously he was a post-doc in Political Theory at Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies. He was a part of a high number of research projects in various capacities (including two as PI). He presented at a high number of international conferences, some of which are IR but mostly Political Theory. The same observation is relevant for the academic events that he organised, the courses he taught, and the publications he submitted.

The candidate has submitted 3 publications, all of which articles. European Journal of Social Theory is a respectable journal in a cognate field. The other two are not recognised Political Science journals, although the articles analyse world politics themes through the adoption of interdisciplinary methods. The candidate cannot be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. NICOLÒ CONTI

The candidate holds a PhD in Political Science — Political Theory from Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies (2003). He has taught university courses since 2001, but with the only exception of one course in 2018-2019, all taught courses were not in Political Science but rather in Philosophy. In 2004-2006 he has been a post-doc research fellow at the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies, and since 2008 a research fellow at the Universidade Nova de Lisboa in the academic field of Philosophy. He has participated to various national research projects funded by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Portuguese Fundação para a Ciência e a Tecnologia. He has participated as a speaker to a sizable number of national and international conferences although only rarely to conferences of the most recognised international scientific organisations in the field of Political Science.

He submitted for assessment 3 publications consisting of 3 journal articles and his PhD thesis. With the only exception of one article published in a Portuguese journal, none of the other articles is in Political Science, as it is clearly shown by their contents, methods and publication outlets focused on other disciplines. His PhD thesis has an interdisciplinary approach related more to Sociology and Philosophy than to Political Science.

The candidate cannot be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. ANDREA RUGGERI

The candidate is Auxiliary Researcher at Instituto de Filosofia, Universidade Nova de Lisboa. He holds a PhD in Political Science — Political Theory from Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies (2003). He has taught university courses since 2001, but with the only exception of one course in 2018-2019, all taught courses were not in Political Science but rather in Philosophy. In 2004-2006 he has been a post-doc research fellow at the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies. He has participated to various national research. He has attended national and international conferences, yet mostly not within Political Science.

He submitted 3 journal articles and his PhD thesis, the majority of these outputs do not belong to Political Science.

The candidate cannot be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. PINAR BILGIN

The candidate holds a PhD in International Relations from the London School of Economics (2012). Since 2017, he has been a Lecturer and a Senior Lecturer at the University of Bristol. He has taught at the University level since 2013. The candidate has held personal fellowships including a Leverhulme fellowship at the LSE and a small research grant but no research project collaboration is listed on his CV. The candidate has presented at international seminars and conferences, including well-recognised IR conferences (such as ISA and EISA PEC, to which admission is not by invitation, but competitive and refereed).

The candidate has submitted 15 publications, including 1 single authored monograph by a respectable international commercial publisher, 9 journal articles, 3 book chapters, and 2 non-peer reviewed publications. Of these journals, European Journal of International Relations is a top journal and Geopolitics is particularly noteworthy for Political Science.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. NICOLÒ CONTI

The candidate holds a PhD in International Relations from the London School of Economics (2012). He has taught university courses since 2013. Since 2017, he has been a Lecturer and a Senior Lecturer at the University of Bristol. He received a Leverhulme Early Career Fellowship and several small grants from prestigious national research bodies such as ESRC and BA. The candidate has presented at international conferences, including conferences of the most recognised international scientific organisations in the field of Political Science.

The candidate has submitted 15 publications, including 1 monograph with a recognised international publisher, 9 journal articles, 3 book chapters, and 2 other non-peer reviewed publications. Some of his articles are in top international journals particularly noteworthy for Political Science.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. ANDREA RUGGERI

The candidate is Senior Lecturer of Politics and International Relations at the School of Sociology, Politics and International Studies at the University of Bristol since 2022. He was Lecturer in the same department from 2017 until 2022. He was Leverhulme Research Fellow at the LSE Middle East Centre between 2014 and 2017. The candidate holds a PhD in International Relations from the London School of Economics and Political Science (2012). Moreover, he obtained a Postgraduate Certificate in Higher Education in the UK. He received a Leverhulme Early Career Fellowship and several small grants from national prestigious national research bodies such as ESRC and BA. He has presented at international conferences and has been invited by several Political Science departments to present his research. He has taught at LSE and the University of Bristol course of International Relations and IR of the Middle East.

He submitted for assessment 15 publications consisting of 1 monograph, 9 journal articles, 3 book chapters, 1 conference proceeding and 1 piece in a departmental paper series. These publications cover a broad range of topics in Political Science, International Relations and Area Studies with a common thread on the area of the Middle East, conflict and refugees dynamics. Overall, the research output signals a clear academic maturity.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

CANDIDATE Id 1157892

PROF. PINAR BILGIN

The candidate holds a PhD in Political and Social Sciences from the European University Institute (2005). He has taught at the University level since 2001 in addition to study abroad programmes in Italy (1996-2007). During 2004-06 she was a post-doc researcher at the Catholic University of Milan. During 2013-17, she was an Assistant Professor at Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies. Since 2022, she has served as an academic expert at the Italian National School of Administration. Throughout this period (some of which was spent at non-research positions) she supervised and examined PhD theses. In addition to the above-listed positions, the candidate has held several visiting and contractual positions at prestigious institutions in Italy. She has been a part of a high number of projects funded by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Italian Ministry of Education, Military Centre for Strategic Studies CEMISS. She has participated as a speaker to high number of local and international seminars and conferences.

The candidate has submitted for assessment 15 publications, including 11 journal articles, 3 books and 1 book chapter. All three books are single-authored. One is published by a respectable international commercial publisher, and the other 2 are locally published. Of the 11 articles, one is published in the Journal of Common Market Studies, which is a top journal. All the others were published in respectable peer-reviewed journals with a variable degree of recognition in the field of Political Science.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. NICOLÒ CONTI

The candidate holds a PhD in Political and Social Sciences from the European University Institute (2005). She taught university courses in Political science in different Italian universities in 2001-2002 and from 2006 until 2022; she also taught in international study abroad programmes based in Italy between 1996 and 2007. From 2013 until 2022 she was a post-doc research fellow in Political Science and an assistant professor at the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies. She was visiting research fellow in two international academic institutions in 2014 and 2018 (University of Westminster London and Higher School of Economics (HSE) Moscow, respectively). She participated to various national projects funded by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Italian Ministry of Education, Military Center for Strategic Studies CEMISS. She has participated as a speaker to a large number of national and international conferences, although rarely to conferences of the most recognised international scientific organisations in the field of Political Science.

She submitted for assessment 15 publications consisting of 3 monographs, 12 journal articles, 1 book chapter. These publications cover a broad range of topics in Political Science pertaining to International relations, EU external relations, cultural policy. Her works show a variable level of quality and maturity, some are more ambitious and have been published on important international outlets, others have more limited scope and ambition. One of her monographs is published by a recognised international publisher and the other two monographs by two Italian national/local publishers.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. ANDREA RUGGERI

The candidate appears to be a Lecturer at Italian National School of Administration in Rome. She holds a PhD from the EUI in Political and Social Sciences (2005). She has been a post-doc research fellow in Political Science and an assistant professor at the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies. She has been part of several national projects funded. She has attended national and international

conferences. She has taught university courses in Political science in different Italian universities with a hiatus. She was visiting research fellow at University of Westminster London and at HSE in Moscow.

She submitted for assessment 15 publications consisting of 3 monographs, 11 journal articles, 1 book chapter all in the field of Political Science. There is an important variation in terms of outputs and outlets quality in her research production.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. PINAR BILGIN

The candidate holds a PhD in Political Science from University of California, Los Angeles (2009). He has taught at the University level since 2011 at Tel Aviv University, Duke University (visiting) and Tokyo International University. He spent 2009-2011 as a post-doc fellow at the Centre for Military and Strategic Studies, University of Calgary. The candidate has held personal fellowships but no research grant or research project collaboration is listed on his CV. The candidate also has not listed any conference attendance, but service to the community in the form of editorial board membership of Middle East Journal of Management (not an area relevant to the position under consideration) and refereeing for IR journals.

The candidate has submitted 9 publications, all of which are journal articles and 6 of them are co-authored. These articles were published in peer-reviewed journals of moderate ranking, known mostly for publishing case studies and less so for theoretically and/or methodologically innovative scholarship. The articles under consideration cover a range of issues in political Science related to Middle East affairs with a specific focus on the study of military security and terrorism.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. NICOLÒ CONTI

The candidate holds a PhD in Political Science from University of California, Los Angeles (2009). He has taught university courses since 2011 at Tel Aviv University, Duke University (visiting) and Tokyo International University. He spent 2009-2011 as a post-doc fellow at the Centre for Military and Strategic Studies, University of Calgary. The candidate has held personal fellowships but no research grant or research project collaboration is listed on his CV. The candidate also has not listed any conference attendance.

The candidate has submitted 9 publications. All are journal articles with a specific Political Science focus on the study of military security and terrorism, they have been published in journals of average reputation and show an average quality of his research production.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. ANDREA RUGGERI

The candidate is untenured Associate Professor at the Institute for International Strategy at the Tokyo International University. He holds a PhD in Political Science from University of California, Los Angeles (2009). He was Postdoctoral Fellow at the Centre for Military and Strategic Studies, University of Calgary. He has taught at the University level at Tel Aviv University, Duke University (visiting) and Tokyo International University. The candidate has held personal fellowships but no research grant or research project collaboration is listed on his CV. The candidate also has not listed any conference attendance.

The candidate has submitted 9 articles for the formal evaluation. Most of the articles are published in Area Studies journals and three in conflict/security outlets relevant for Political Science. His research agenda focuses on the Middle East and security/conflict dynamics.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. PINAR BILGIN

The candidate holds a PhD in Global Politics and Human Rights from Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies (2016). He has taught at the University level at Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies since 2019. He also contributed in various capacities to postgraduate level courses at the same institution and others. Since 2017 he has been a post-doc researcher to four research projects (three of them internationally funded including two H2020 projects). He has presented at a high number of local and international seminars and conferences. Some of these are well-recognised IR conferences (such as ISA and EISA PEC, where admission is not by invitation but competitive and refereed).

The candidate has submitted for assessment 15 publications, including 13 articles and 2 books. Of the 2 books, one is locally published, the other co-authored monograph is published by a respectable international commercial publisher. Of the 13 articles, 7 are co-authored. Of these Geopolitics and Conflict, Security and Development are particularly noteworthy journals for Political Science.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. NICOLÒ CONTI

The candidate holds a PhD in Global Politics and Human Rights from Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies (2016). He has taught university courses in the field of Political Science since 2019. Since 2017 he has been a post-doc research fellow and a (non-tenured) assistant professor in Political Science at the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies and a visiting research fellow in two recognised international academic institutions in 2014 and 2018 (Oslo Research School on Peace and Conflict and Universidad Autonoma of Madrid, respectively). He has participated to various national and international research projects funded by H2020 of the European Commission, Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, Norwegian Research Council. He has participated as a speaker to a large number of national and international conferences including conferences of some of the most recognised international scientific organisations in the field of Political Science.

He submitted for assessment 15 publications consisting of 2 monographs and 13 journal articles. Several of these works have appeared on prestigious international journals, one monograph is published by a recognised international publisher and the other monograph by an Italian national publisher. In his whole production, the candidate certifies himself as a political scientist expert on Africa, resulting in his works on the subject being very accurate and in-depth, as well as being cited in important international publishing outlets.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. ANDREA RUGGERI

The candidate is a Researcher at Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies (SSSA), Pisa. Since 2017 he has been a post-doc research fellow and a (non-tenured) assistant professor in Political Science at the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies and a visiting research fellow at PRIO of Oslo and Universidad Autonoma of Madrid. He holds a PhD in Global Politics and Human Rights from SSSA (2016). Since 2019 he has been teaching university courses in the field of Political Science. He has participated to various and prestigious national and international research projects funded, among several, by the European Commission and Norwegian Research Council. He has attended many national and international conferences.

He submitted for assessment 15 publications consisting of 2 monographs and 13 journal articles. Several pieces of research have been published in highly competitive peer-reviewed international journals in Political science. One monograph is published by an international publisher and the other monograph by an Italian national publisher. His research agenda is clear, systematic and impactful

positioning himself as one the top national African experts on transnational and international contentious dynamics.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

The candidate holds a PhD in Politics from the University of Durham (2017). The candidate has teaching experience from having taught at the undergraduate and postgraduate level at Tübingen University and Lancaster University. He has also listed experience with postgraduate supervision. The candidate currently has three affiliations: He is a lecturer at the University of Lancaster, Hillary Rodham Clinton fellow at Queen's University Belfast, and Senior Researcher at Open Think Tank (Kurdistan-Iraq). He was previously a visiting lecturer at Tübingen University and a post-doc fellow at the University of Durham. The candidate has held personal fellowships. He also indicates a sizeable EC grant as well as being PI on a research project and participating in an EC-funded project, but specific and precise details are not offered on the CV. The candidate highlights his service to the community in the form of refereeing for IR journals as well as engagement with policy practitioners at local and international levels.

The candidate has submitted 4 publications, 3 of which are articles and the 4th one is a book. The book is published by Routledge, a respectable international commercial publisher. The articles (two of which are co-authored) are published in peer-reviewed journals particularly reputable for addressing more the policy community and less so the scholarly community. The candidate's research focus is in Middle East area studies.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. NICOLÒ CONTI

The candidate holds a PhD in Politics from the University of Durham (2017). He is Lecturer in Politics at the University of Lancaster and he also holds a Research Fellowship at the University of Queen's Belfast. He held a Postdoctoral AHRC fellowship at the University of Durham between 2017 and 2019. The candidate has taught university courses at Tübingen University and Lancaster University. The candidate lists several grants, the most notable of which is a European Commission grant, but it is not clear if he was PI (and what ERC or Horizon programme). The candidate lists some talks, but of them none to internationally recognised Political Science conferences.

The candidate has submitted 4 publications: 1 monograph (Routledge) and 3 articles. Moreover, he submitted his PhD thesis. The articles are published in journals of average reputation in the field of Political Science, they have a focus on the Middle East.

The candidate can be admitted to the public discussion.

PROF. ANDREA RUGGERI

The candidate is Lecturer in Politics at the University of Lancaster and he has at the moment also a Research Fellowship at the University of Queen's Belfast. He had a Postdoctoral AHRC fellowship at the University of Durham between 2017 and 2019. He holds a PhD in Politics from the University of Durham (2017). The candidate has taught University classes at Tübingen University and Lancaster University. The candidate lists several grants of which the most notable is a European Commission grant, however his role is not clear and as well it is not clear what ERC or Horizon programme. The candidate has submitted 4 publications: 1 monograph with a recognised international publisher and 3 articles. Moreover, he submitted his PhD thesis. The articles are published in journals of average reputation in Political science. All his work has as a focus on Middle East area studies.
