ANNEX 1 – MINUTES OF THE THIRD MEETING
INDIVIDUAL ASSESSMENT by Prof. Matteo Barigozzi

1363527

The candidate holds the position of professor in Econometrics Macroeconomics and Capital Markets at the Universidad Libre Cali, Colombia, although specific job responsibilities have not been specified. His research primarily focuses on the Colombian economy. The papers predominantly consist of descriptive pieces that often take the form of reports rather than traditional scientific articles. He has not published any works that are indexed in Scopus.

Overall evaluation: Non-satisfactory.

1369598

The candidate holds the position of associate professor Economic Statistics at the University of Rome "Tor Vergata." His research primarily focuses on financial economics and monetary economics, employing time series and Bayesian analyses as their primary research methods. He has published 24 papers indexed in Scopus with many appearing in highly regarded journals. Most of the papers make methodological contributions but only a few focus on macroeconomics and business fluctuations. He is actively involved in research activities primarily related to Italian projects. He has a vast teaching experience at various levels, from undergraduate to graduate and Ph.D. levels and covering the fields of financial econometrics, macroeconometrics, and time-series analysis. He lacks eligibility in the specific sector addressed in this call, "Economia Politica" (A-1), but holds the eligibility in the sectors of "Politica Economica" (A-2), "Econometria" (A-5), and "Statistica Economica" (D-2).

Overall evaluation: very-good.

Moneta Alessio

The candidate holds the position of Associate Professor in Economics at Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna, Pisa. His methodological research primarily focuses on causality in empirical macroeconomics and evaluation of simulated micro-founded models as Agent-Based models, with applications in the fields of monetary economics, the examination of household consumption patterns in relation to income, and the dynamics of energy consumption. Overall, his research is very relevant to the field of political economy and its subfields. He has published 31 papers that are indexed in Scopus, many of which are in very high-quality journals. He has an extensive international experience with an established network of collaborations with scholars from around the world and has actively participated in several national and international projects. He has a vast teaching experience at various levels, from undergraduate to graduate and Ph.D. levels and covering the fields of macroeconomics in both theoretical and empirical contexts, as well as economic methodology. He currently serves as the coordinator of the International Ph.D. Program in Economics at the Sant'Anna School. He holds the eligibility in the sector relevant to this call, "Economia Politica" (A-1), as well as in "Politica Economica" (A-2).

Overall evaluation: excellent.

The candidate holds the position of Associate Professor in Mathematics for Economics and Finance at the University of Rome "Tor Vergata." His research mainly focuses on financial econometrics. He has authored a total of 18 papers indexed in Scopus. Many of these publications are in very high-quality and even top journals. He is actively involved in research activities primarily related to Italian projects. He has a vast teaching experience at various levels, from undergraduate to graduate and Ph.D. levels and covering the fields of finance, calculus, probability, and stochastic processes. He has a vast

teaching experience at various levels, from undergraduate to graduate and Ph.D. levels and covering the fields of finance, calculus, probability and stochastic processes, but he has no teaching experience in macroeconomics. He lacks eligibility in the specific sector addressed in this call, "Economia Politica" (A-1), but holds the eligibility in "Politica Economica" (A-2), "Econometria" (A-5) and "Metodi matematici dell'economia e delle scienze attuariali e finanziarie" (D-4).

Overall evaluation: very-good.

The candidate holds the position of Associate Professor for Economic Policy at the University of Urbino Carlo Bo. His research mostly focuses on economic development and economic growth. He has 48 articles indexed in Scopus, most published in good journals. He is involved in research activities primarily related to Italian projects. He has a vast teaching experience at various levels, from undergraduate to graduate and Ph.D. levels and covering the fields of microeconomics, econometrics, applied statistics, but he has limited teaching experience in macroeconomics. He holds the eligibility in the sector of the call, "Political Economy" (A-1).

Overall evaluation: good.

1372806

The candidate holds the position of Associate Professor in Political Economy at the University of L'Aquila. His research mostly focuses on macroeconomics and monetary economics, particularly at the theoretical level. He has 22 articles indexed in Scopus, the majority of which have been published in respected journals. He has actively participated in various international projects and has a wide network of international collaborations. He has a vast teaching experience at various levels, from undergraduate to graduate and Ph.D. levels and covering the fields of macroeconomics, labor economics, economic growth, public economics, theory of the firm, and the history of economic thought, but has no teaching experience in empirical macroeconomics and time-series econometrics. He holds the eligibility in the specific sector addressed in this call, "Political Economy," (A-1).

Overall evaluation: quite-good.

INDIVIDUAL ASSESSMENT by Prof. Thomas Brenner

1343527

Professor at the Universidad Libre Cali, Colombia. His research focuses on the Colombian economy and his work is descriptive based on indicator calculations. A fit to the position is not directly visible.

No publications can be found in the Web of Science.

He claims to have taught in Econometrics, Macroeconomics and Capital Markets, but no details are given.

Overall evaluation: not up to the standard

Associate Professor for Economic Statistics, Università degli Studi di Roma. His research focuses on financial economics and monetary economics applying time series and Bayesian analyses. A direct connection to the field of political economy is not visible.

16 journal papers can be found in the Web of Science. Most of them are published in good but not outstanding international journals. The papers show a clear focus on econometric studies. Some papers are based on innovative approaches.

Co-authorships show a large network with some focus on Italian colleagues. Networking activities are manifold, including research visits and positions in various countries worldwide.

Teaching experience is given but only in methodological courses.

Overall evaluation: good (due to a limited fit)

Alessio Moneta

Associate Professor for Economics, Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna, Pisa. His research focuses on Applied Econometrics. He uses and develops highly complex econometric methods, such as the Cointegrated Structural Vector Autoregressive models. These approaches are applied to various different economic fields including the field of political economy.

21 journal papers can be found in the Web of Science. Most of them are published in good, some in excellent international journals. The papers are quite heterogeneous, showing a broad knowledge of economics.

Co-authorships show a large network with many scientists from different countries. Networking activities are manifold, including research visits and positions in various countries worldwide. The CV shows great funding success with various funding institutions from different countries.

Teaching experience is given, including mainly methodological courses but also courses in the field of Macroeconomics.

Overall evaluation: excellent

1375196

Associate Professor for Mathematics for Economics and Finance, Università degli Studi di Roma. His research focuses on Financial Econometrics, high-frequency data and market microstructure. He uses complex econometric methods and develops new indicators for empirical research. The approaches are mainly applied within Financial Economics.

15 journal papers can be found in the Web of Science. Most of them are published in good, some in excellent international journals. The papers are heterogeneous, especially in the methods used.

Co-authorships show a large network with some focus on Italian colleagues. There are a few foreign contacts and stays. He has been able to obtain large amounts of research funding in the last ten years.

Teaching experience is given, but mainly in methodological courses in the context of finance.

Overall evaluation: very good (due to a limited fit)

Associate Professor for Economic Policy, Università di Urbino Carlo Bo. His research focuses on economic modelling in the fields of Economic Growth and Economic Development. He mainly uses theoretical models to analyse various relevant economic questions.

23 journal papers can be found in the Web of Science. Most of them are published in good, some in excellent international journals. The papers show quite a range of applications. Most of them are based on theoretical modelling, applying existing models or combinations to specific economic questions. A few papers are based on empirical studies.

Co-authorships show a large network with some focus on the national level. Some research visits in other countries have been done. There is no information on research fundings obtained.

Teaching experience is very diverse and extensive. It ranges from methodological course to applied courses and several course in the field of Economic Policy.

Overall evaluation: very good

1312806

Associate Professor of Political Economy, Link Campus University of Rome. His research focuses on Monetary Economics. He uses mainly economic modelling to tackle various diverse questions in the field of Political Economy.

14 journal papers can be found in the Web of Science. Most of them are published in good or excellent international journals. The papers are based on theoretical modelling mainly in the field of fiscal policy and policies in (financial) crisis.

Co-authorships show a large network with many scientists from different countries. This seems to be due to a long lasting employment in the UK. Further network activities are based on research visits in Norway and EU project grants.

Teaching experience is multifold, containing very different economic fields.

Overall evaluation: very good

INDIVIDUAL ASSESSMENT by Prof. Giovanni Dosi

The candidate does not present any publication indexed in Scopus.
The presented works lack originality and sometimes are just descriptive reports.
It is neither clear what teaching role the candidate occupies or has occupied.
The overall evaluation is *non satisfactory*.

1375186

The candidate is currently associate professor of 'Mathematical Methods of Economics and Social Sciences' (D-4) at the University of Rome "Tor Vergata". The publications, especially in the field of quantitative finance and financial econometrics are rigorous and original in their formal contributions. Prof Pirino display an impressive record of successful coordinations of research projects and teams, and a relatively long record of teaching, mainly in the field of statistics and econometrics (e.g. stochastic processes, calculus, differential equations, etc), while much less on economic subjects. He does not have the eligibility ("abilitazione") in the sector of this call ('Economia Politica, A-1'), but does have one in 'Economic Policy' (A-2), in addition to 'Econometrics' (A-5) and 'Mathematical Methods' (D-4).
In general, publications and teaching experience do not give any hint that the candidate masters the general area covered by the statutory definition of 'political economy'.
This notwithstanding, my overall evaluation is *very good*.

Moneta

The candidate is currently associate professor of political economy at the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies, Pisa.
His publications are rigorous, original and often published in top field journals. They mainly address, on methodological grounds, issues of causal inference and evaluation of simulation models especially of the Agent-Based kind, and in term of objects of analysis, consumption patterns, dynamics of energy use, patterns of innovation diffusion, monetary economics, empirical macroeconomics, among others.
The whole set of publications reveals a remarkable control upon the different subdomains of political economy and equally remarkable interdisciplinarity, from philosophy to economics.
Prof Moneta has a vast international experience and network of collaborations.
He has been teaching for long time at the undergraduate, graduate and Ph.D. levels and is currently the coordinator of the International Ph.D. Program in Economics at the Sant'Anna School.
He holds the eligibility ("abilitazione") in 'Political Economy' (A-1) and 'Economic Policy' (A-2).
My evaluation of the candidate is *outstanding*.

1369588

The candidate is associate professor of economic statistics at the university of Rome "Tor Vergata". His contributions build on a solid formation in econometrics and primarily concern spatial and time series econometrics and Bayesian inference techniques. Some of them offer original methodological refinements. The economic applications, not too frequent, regard mostly financial markets and more recently DSGE macroeconomic models.
The participation/organization of research activities concerns mainly Italian projects.
Teaching activities have been in the area of financial econometrics, macroeconometrics and time series analysis.

His path to academic maturity appears still not over , especially with respect to that full grasp of the economic discipline which should be required to become an ordinary professor in political economy.
My overall evaluation is *good*.

1372806

The candidate, currently associate professor of political economy at L'Aquila University. He presents an ensemble of works covering a wide set of subjects quite central to the general concerns of political economy , ranging from the interpretation of the current crisis to Stock-Flow-Consistent models , the role of finance with respect economic instability , and a few others , including , last but not least, topical issues in the history of economic thought. Inevitably , given the theoretical perspective of the author , these works have been published on non-mainstream journals . Still , even conditional upon the smaller reference community , the impact has been quite small (a total of 175 Scopus citations including self-citations , as of October 21, 2023).

Professor Passarella has a solid record of international collaborations and management of research projects , including a major EU-sponsored project at the University of Leeds.

The teaching subjects include history of economics thought , growth, and labour economics.

He holds the eligibility ("abilitazione") in political economy (A-1) and Economic Policy (A-2)

My overall evaluation is *quite good* .

1359667

The candidate is currently associate professor of political economy at the University of Urbino. His numerous publications, appeared in good international venues, cover different domains of the discipline , including growth and development, inequality and poverty traps , and evolutionary games. They are solid contributions containing solid empirical insights.

The candidate has undertaken joint research activities , even if primarily at national level .

The teaching record is long and abundant , mastering different fields, including macroeconomics, applied statistics, political economy, international economics.

He holds the eligibility in 'political economy' (A-1)

My overall evaluation is *very good* .

INDIVIDUAL ASSESSMENT by Prof.ssa Alessandra Faggian

The candidate is professor of Econometric, Macro-economics and Capital Markets at the Universidad Libre Cali (Colombia). It is difficult to clearly evaluate the candidate because many details are missing, e.g. teaching responsibilities. As far as research is concerned, the publications presented are mainly descriptive and not very advanced methodologically and they primarily look at the national context (Colombia). None of them seems to have been published in internationally indexed journals (either ISI or Scopus).

Overall evaluation: Non-satisfactory.

The candidate is Associate Professor of Economic Statistics at the University of Rome "Tor Vergata". He published extensively in internationally well-regarded indexed journals, mainly in the field of financial and monetary economics. The methodology used is mostly time series and Bayesian analysis. He lists participation in several research projects, but all in the national (Italian) context. He has extensive teaching experience at all levels, from undergraduate to postgraduate (PhDs), especially in more methodological courses (e.g. financial econometrics and macroeconometrics). He has spent time abroad with visiting worldwide.

Overall evaluation: very good.

Moneta Alessio

The candidate is Associate Professor of Economics at Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna of Pisa. He published extensively in internationally indexed journals, some of them of excellent standard and quality. He is an expert of agent-based models applied in various contexts and to different economic problems. Some of the publications show a good degree of interdisciplinarity. Overall, the research track record fits well the political economy field. He has been successful in attracting grant funding to support his research projects through the years. He also benefits from a very extensive network of international collaborations. He has very extensive teaching experience at all levels, from undergraduate to postgraduate (Ph.Ds), both in macroeconomics courses and in more methodological ones. He serves as PhD program coordinator of the International Ph.D. in Economics at Sant'Anna.

Overall evaluation: excellent.

The candidate is Associate Professor in Mathematics for Economics and Finance at the University of Rome "Tor Vergata". He published extensively in internationally well-regarded indexed journals, mainly in the field of financial econometrics. He lists participation in several research projects, but mainly in the national (Italian) context. He has been successful in attracting grant funding to support his research projects. He has extensive teaching experience at all levels, from undergraduate to postgraduate (PhDs). Courses taught include finance, calculus, probability, and stochastic processes (no teaching experience in macroeconomics is listed).

Courses taught include microeconomics, econometrics and applied statistics, (no teaching experience in macroeconomics is listed).

Overall evaluation: good.

The candidate is Associate Professor in Political Economy at the University of L'Aquila. He has published extensively and some of his articles appeared in good international field journals. His research focuses mainly on monetary economics and economic modelling. He has strong international collaborations, especially in the UK. He has extensive teaching experience at all levels, from undergraduate to postgraduate (PhDs). Courses taught

include macroeconomics, labour economics, economic growth, public economics, theory of the firm and the history of economic thought (no teaching experience in macroeconomics is listed).
Overall evaluation: good.

INDIVIDUAL ASSESSMENT by Prof. Mauro Napoletano

The candidate is professor of Econometrics at the Universidad Libre Cali, Colombia. No details on the role are provided. His works mostly focus on the Colombian economy. All works are highly descriptive and most of them look structured as reports and not like scientific papers. The candidate does not have any publications indexed in Scopus.

The candidate has also a variegated teaching experience in macroeconomics, both theory and empirics, and in economic methodology at different levels (undergraduate, graduate and Ph.D. levels) and he is currently the coordinator of the International Ph.D. Program in Economics at the Sant'Anna School. Finally, the candidate holds the eligibility in the sector of the call ('Political Economy, A-1) , and in 'Economic Policy' (A-2).

Overall evaluation: excellent

The participation/organization of research activities concern mainly Italian projects. The candidate has teaching experience at various levels (undergraduate, graduate and Ph.D. levels) that focuses on finance, calculus, probability and stochastic processes. The candidate does not have eligibility in the sector of this call ('Economia Politica, A-1) , but he does have one in 'Economic Policy' (A-2). In addition, he has eligibility in 'Econometrics' (A-5) and 'Mathematical Methods' (D-4)

He has teaching experience at undergraduate, graduate and Ph.D. levels and covering the fields of finance, calculus, probability, and stochastic processes, but he provides no evidence of teaching experience in macroeconomics. He lacks eligibility in the specific sector addressed in this call, "Economia Politica" (A-1), but holds the eligibility in "Politica Economica" (A-2), as well as in "Econometria" (A-5) and "Metodi matematici dell'economia e delle scienze attuariali e finanziarie" (D-4).

He holds the eligibility in the sector of the call, "Political Economy" (A-1).
