

## The Conference

In the last two decades China has progressively increased its involvement in United Nations PKOs, up to the extent that today it is the main troop-contributing country among the permanent members of the Security Council. Italy, on the other hand, has offered its steady engagement since the very beginning of UN PKOs. Indeed, its approach has come to be known as the "Italian way to peacekeeping". The conference aims at: discussing, in a comparative way, the Italian and Chinese experiences; distilling lessons learned and identifying current challenges and trends. The conference will see the participation of **Staffan de Mistura**, Under-secretary of State, Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and **Gianluigi Magri**, Under-secretary of State, Italian Ministry of Defense.
